Toronto - Thursday, 26th February, 1998

The Treasurer, the Benchers and their guests proceeded to the auditorium at Roy Thomson Hall, Toronto for the Call to the Bar ceremonies of the 367 graduates and 10 transfer candidates of the 39th Bar Admission Course.

CONVOCATION WAS CALLED TO ORDER AT 3:15 P.M.

CONFERRING OF AN HONORARY DEGREE

Mr. Philip Epstein, Q.C., Chair of the Admissions and Equity Committee introduced the Doctoral candidate, Mr. Robert K. Rae, Q.C. and read the following citation:

“It is my most pleasant duty to present to you and to this Convocation the Honourable Robert Keith Rae, and to request that you confer upon him the degree of Doctor of Laws honoris causa.

His has been a career marked by high achievement in government and in the practice of law. He was first elected to the House of Commons in 1978, and served continuously until 1982, when he became leader of the New Democratic Party of Ontario and was elected to the Ontario legislature. He served as Leader of the Official Opposition before becoming Premier in 1990.

His government presided over a major restructuring of the Ontario economy during the most difficult recession since the 1930's, and made significant advances in social policy.

Bob Rae is known throughout the country for his leadership in advancing initiatives to strengthen Canada's constitutional framework. He is widely respected for his passionate defence of national unity, and for advocating a flexible and progressive federalism.

In 1995 Bob Rae returned to the private sector as a partner at the law firm of Goodman, Phillips and Vineberg. His record of outstanding leadership in government, in advancing social policy and in advancing the cause of Canada have brought honour to the profession, and he is truly deserving of the award of Doctor of Laws honoris causa.”

The Treasurer admitted Robert K. Rae, Q.C. to the degree of Doctor of Laws, honoris causa.

Mr. Rae then addressed the graduates and guests.
