

## Law Society of Ontario 2020 Annual Report

### Professional Regulation statistics

#### Complaints received in 2020

In 2020, the number of new complaints received in Professional Regulation was 9% lower than the number received in 2019 and 5.1% lower than the number received in 2018.

New complaints received, 2015 to 2020

With respect to the 3,987 new complaints received in Professional Regulation in 2020, the breakdown by subject and by complainant are consistent with past years.

The breakdown by subject was:

- 80% against lawyers
- 12% against paralegals
- The remaining complaints/cases involved non-licensees and lawyer and paralegal applicants.

The breakdown by complainant was:

- 74% of complaints were brought by members of the public
- 12% of complaints were brought by licensees
- 14% of complaints were internally raised (i.e., the complainant is the Law Society).

## Types of complaints

The types of allegations raised in complaints received in Professional Regulation and those complaints transferred to Investigations in 2020 were similar to the types of allegations raised in these two groups in the past few years. With respect to the underlying complaints in the notices filed in 2020, there were more governance issues raised than in previous years.

## Areas of law raised in complaints

Note that these statistics include only complaints in which at least one area of law was identified. More than one area of law can be identified in a complaint.

The areas of law raised in complaints received in Professional Regulation, complaints transferred to Investigations and the underlying complaints in notices filed with the Tribunal in 2020 were similar to the areas of law raised in these groups in the past few years.

## Hearings before the Law Society Tribunal – Hearing Division

### Notices filed

In 2020, 165 notices were filed: 109 involved lawyers; 42 involved paralegals; 7 involved paralegal applicants; 7 involved lawyer applicants.

### Completed hearings

Note that a “completed hearing” for Professional Regulation is defined as one in which the Law Society Tribunal – Hearing Division has rendered a final order and the Tribunal is considered *functus* or when a matter has been withdrawn, abandoned or deemed abandoned.

In 2020, a total of 123 hearings were completed before the Law Society Tribunal – Hearing Division: 90 involving lawyers/lawyer applicants; 33 involving paralegals/paralegal applicants.

### Penalties imposed in conduct matters

#### Penalties imposed in conduct matters completed in 2015 to 2020

Similar results are found with respect to the proportion of yearly totals that each type of penalty has. For example, suspensions constitute, on average, about 54% of all penalties imposed (with a range between 51% and 58% in the 6 years depicted).
