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## Service cuts needed to curb legal aid deficit

The Ontario Legal Aid Plan is considering eliminating certificate services in a number of areas of law in order to control a projected \$65-million deficit at the end of this fiscal year. The Plan is also canvassing a

number of other options to reduce its costs.

The proposals will not affect the payment of lawyers' outstanding accounts.

"We want to make it absolutely clear that we intend to honour all outstanding financial obligations to the

lawyers in this province who have represented legal aid clients," said Fran Kiteley, chair of the Society's legal aid committee.

"We are aware that our decision to delay the payment of accounts at the end of

the Plan's fiscal year last March pending new cash flow from the provincial treasury has exacted a regrettable financial toll on legal aid practitioners. But lawyers are assured that all monies owed will be paid in full," Ms. Kiteley added.

The Plan's forecasted deficit represents the excess of expenditures paid mainly to lawyers for services rendered to clients over revenue paid to the Plan by its major funders namely, the Ontario Government, the federal government, the Law Society and the Law Foundation. The Plan also receives income from clients contributing to their representation and from investments.

Expenditures are expected to total \$284.7 million and revenue is expected to total \$257.8 million in fiscal 1995 creating a shortfall of \$26.9 million. In addition, the Plan carried over \$38.8 million in unpaid accounts into the current year when it exhausted its cash flow at its 1994 fiscal year

## Society's costs mount when lawyers fail to reply

Lawyers who fail to reply to correspondence from the Law Society regarding client complaints are placing a significant financial burden on the Society which ultimately all lawyers pay for.

In 1993, of the 450 lawyers charged with professional misconduct or conduct unbecoming, 107 were charged because of their failure to reply to the Society. So far in 1994, 49 members have been charged.

When asked at discipline hearings why they neglected to respond to the Society, typically most lawyers say that they believed the complaint had no merit.

Members are reminded that the Society has an obligation to investigate **all** complaints from members of the public and lawyers are required to respond to **all** correspondence and telephone inquiries from the Society.

Recently discipline committees have begun assessing costs of approximately \$2,000 against members who have failed to reply to the Society.

end last March, accounting for a total anticipated shortfall of approximately \$65 million for 1995.

For the twenty-five years of the Plan's operation, the Ontario Government funded the Plan's shortfalls. In the current year, however, the Plan has already received notice from the Ministry of the Attorney General that the Ontario Treasury—the Plan's primary funder—has allocated a fixed sum for Legal Aid and has indicated that alternative means will have to be found to meet any excess expenditures in the 1995 fiscal year.

"The Legal Aid Committee has historically taken the position that service reduction had to be the last option in addressing budgetary concerns. Notwithstanding enormous financial pressures over the last five years, service cuts have been avoided. Service cuts or a moratorium on delivery of certain services now must be implemented if we are to live within the financial 'envelope' provided to us," Ms. Kiteley reported.

The Plan is under pressure to implement cost-saving measures, including service cuts, almost immediately in order to ensure that the financial impact of the measures take effect in time to reduce this year's forecasted deficit.

The following service cuts are being explored:

- Moratorium on all certificates for inquests and public inquiries.
- Moratorium on all certificates for wills which are currently granted to seniors receiving the old age security supplement.
- Moratorium on all certificates in personal injury cases which will affect victims of medical malpractice, automobile accidents and wrongful dismissal as well as victims seeking damages for sexual assault and incest. Alternatively, the Plan may consider issuing certificates to cover only disbursements in these matters.
- Moratorium on certificates in small claims court cases. Last year 170 certificates were granted to individuals pursuing monetary claims against, for example, landlords and employers.
- Moratorium on certificates for uncontested divorces for a fixed period of time. Approximately 11,000 individuals would be affected by this measure in a variety of ways.
- Moratorium on all certificates where there is no

possibility of incarceration or no possibility of loss of livelihood.

In addition to eliminating services in some areas, the Plan is also proposing a number of other measures to reduce costs, namely:

- restricting the discretion of area directors in the granting of certificates
- increasing the use of settlement conferences in matrimonial matters
- substituting duty counsel for certificates in family support applications and support variations
- encouraging the more vigorous screening of criminal charges
- rationalizing multiple accused representation
- requiring lawyers in criminal matters to submit an opinion letter after a pre-trial and before a trial to the area director who will decide whether to authorize the continuation of a certificate for trial
- encouraging the provincial government to negotiate with the federal government to reduce the number of offenses which are indictable or indictable at crown election thereby increasing the Plan's discretion over the authorization of certificates
- encouraging the implementation of diversion projects
- implementing franchising in non-detention Young Offender cases. Legal Aid is currently required to provide for the criminal defense of all young offenders regardless of the seriousness of the offense or whether the parents or guardians can contribute financially to their representation. Legal Aid is considering a system whereby counsel who act on such matters will do so at reduced rates.
- revising financial eligibility criteria in order to increase the contributions clients make to their representation or to raise the threshold for granting certificates
- imposing restrictions on the number of times a client can change solicitors. Each solicitor change costs the Plan over \$500.

The Plan will also examine whether fees for certain legal aid services can be trimmed in various ar-

eas. For example:

- reducing fees for uncontested divorces from \$400 to \$200 should the Plan decide not to impose a moratorium on certificates for this service
- eliminating the block fee for bail hearings in summary conviction matters and in hybrid offenses
- restricting multiple court attendances (other than adjournments) by the same lawyer acting on different certificates on the same day
- a one-time 50 or 100 per cent increase in the legal aid levy (included in the Law Society's annual fee) from the current rate of \$292 per member
- reducing the tariff paid on all certificates by five per cent
- obtaining additional funds from the Law Foundation of Ontario which collects the interest on lawyers' mixed trust accounts

## Legal Aid account payments

The Legal Aid Plan is taking a little longer to pay lawyers accounts recently. Lawyers' patience is greatly appreciated.

According to April's statistics, 95 per cent of both criminal and civil standard form accounts are being paid within 45 days. Non-standard form accounts are taking longer with 98 per cent of criminal being paid within 75 days and 97 per cent of civil being paid within 90 days.

## Women's family law centre approved by Convocation

A proposal to establish a women's law centre to deliver comprehensive family law and related services such as crisis counselling, child care, language interpretation and referrals to social service agencies was approved at the May Convocation.

The proposal to set up the centre, which had been turned down initially by benchers last fall, was approved after the Legal Aid Committee made it clear that the service would be directed to women who were victims of domestic abuse. To ensure that information about the centre reaches the intended target group, promotion of the service will be through womens' shelters, hospital trauma units and abused women's advocates.

A number of organizations made representations to the committee charged with the task of designing the family law pilot projects to appeal for a facility that would serve the family law needs of an ever-growing number of female victims of domestic violence.

The results of a recent Statistics Canada survey show that violence against women is widespread. One in four women have experienced physical or sexual violence at the hands of a marital partner. Children witnessed the violence against their mothers in four of ten marriages where violence was reported.

The Legal Aid Committee's decision to offer services to women only was due to a concern that the comfort and safety of abused clients should not be put at risk by the possibility of meeting their spouses in the centre, and that the advocacy role of the centre on behalf of abused women should not be discredited in the community by representing abusers.

Male victims of domestic violence will continue to receive legal aid certificates providing they meet financial eligibility requirements.

The Legal Aid Plan is an equal opportunity employer and consideration will be given to both men and women applying for positions at the centre.

At the conclusion of the debate in Convocation, two Benchers gave notice that they intend to ask Convocation in June to revisit the existing commitment by the Legal Aid Plan and by the Law Society to the pilot projects.

## TD boosts interest rates on mixed trust accounts

Following recent negotiations with all major banks, the Law Foundation is pleased to report that the Toronto-Dominion Bank has agreed to implement a sliding interest rate scale on lawyers trust accounts. The bank's proposal for improved rates is the first that the trustees of the Foundation have found acceptable for approval under Section 57 of the *Law Society Act*.

Effective June 1, all lawyers mixed trust accounts held with the TD will be converted to Business Manager Accounts (BMA) that will pay a variable rate of interest depending on the balance held in the mixed trust account. BMA interest rates are tied to the short term deposit rates.

Due to low interest rates in recent years, the Law Foundation's income shrank to approximately \$10 million in 1993 from about \$48 million in 1990.

The TD agreement is expected to generate important new income for the Law Foundation which, through the interest collected from lawyers' mixed trust accounts, helps to support the Ontario Legal Aid Plan, legal research and education and law libraries throughout Ontario.
