The Treasurer provided a review of the development of the Legal Aid situation over the course of the summer which culminated in the draft regulation which was before Convocation.

LEGAL AID COMMITTEE

Ms. Kiteley presented an oral report of the Legal Aid Committee. The Committee recommended that Convocation approve the draft regulation subject to the regulation being amended to provide that the sections providing for an increased statutory deduction would provide for experience ratings so that for those members in experience levels 3 and 4 (those called to Bar four years or longer) would not be subject to the increased statutory deduction until the \$200,000 level.

It was moved by Paul Copeland, seconded by Carole Curtis that items 5 and 6 on page 1 of the Regulation be deferred until the November Convocation.
